



A 2-WEEK LINGUISTIC STAY IN SPAIN

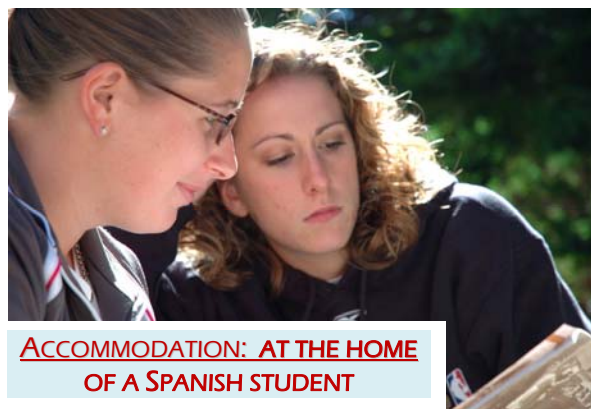
am: Spanish classes for the Irish students

SPANISH CLASSES

The curriculum is designed to complement the **LEAVING CERT SYLLABUS** in the context of a Spanish immersion and guarantees progress in **both oral and written Spanish**. Its principal aim is to give each student a good foundation in basic grammar and communication skills (oral/aural). All levels of Spanish are catered for.

VERY SMALL CLASSES (4 to 8 students max/Centre) maximize personal attention and allow our experienced native teachers to attend to the particular needs and problems of each individual.

WHAT WE DO NOT DO: Numerous language schools offer stays abroad where foreign students usually

1. Gather in big groups/clans,
2. Speak English throughout their stay,
3. Stay in unsupervised accommodation, or
4. Are placed in un-vetted families recruited strictly on a commercial basis,
5. Attend classes of up to 30 students (of different levels),
6. Pay extra fees for optional activities,
7. Have no airport collection and no contact that can reassure their parents,
8. Are left to themselves (no supervision, easy access to alcohol, drugs),
9. Have no access to local Spanish students with whom to practise their Spanish.



Alternative exchange programmes appear more economical and a good initiation, but the mere physical presence in a country, without a structured environment does not suffice to guarantee consistent progress in Spanish.
